

Misconceptions of Hinduism: Caste-System

For years, I have been asked, "Why follow Hinduism when it enforces a hierarchical caste system." ranking people by job?" While hierarchy has created divisions in India for centuries, the original Hindu idea of caste (varna) was not about oppression. In ancient times, people usually inherited their parents' trade, which led to rigid social groupings. Movement between castes was rare mainly downward if someone committed taboo acts.

The system was originally symbolic, describing society as a single body: Brahmins (head) were priests and teachers, guiding knowledge and innovation. Kshatriyas (arms) were rulers and soldiers, protecting society. Vaishyas (stomach) were farmers and merchants, providing necessities. Shudras (legs) were laborers, building infrastructure and doing essential work. Each role was vital; without all four, society could not function.

The Bhagavad Gita often depicts Brahmins as beggars surviving on the kindness of others, reminding us that their role was about spiritual duty, not wealth or privilege. The modern idea of Brahmins being "at the top" is a distortion.

Many also ask about Dalits, or "untouchables." Despite popular belief, they are not part of Hindu scripture. This label emerged around 400 CE, created by rulers to control overpopulated Shudra communities and to counter Buddhism. History shows this kind of manipulation is not unique. In the UK during the 2000s, the media demonized "benefit abusers," making the public believe 27% of welfare spending was fraudulent, when the actual figure

was just 0.7%. The tactic was effective, this misinformation allowed public consensus to cut their own benefits

and safety net.

Hinduism itself has always endured distortions, but its core teachings remain. Misconceptions often come not from scripture but from ruling powers or media shaping narratives for control.

One of my favourite stories from the Bhagavad Gita is of Narad, the demi-god, and a humble farmer, who both show devotion in different ways. The story is called, 'Who is the greatest devotee?' I have attached a short story version at the end of this blog. To summarize, devotion through difficult situations shows true devotion.

Maa Durga's Triumph over Mahishasura

Maa Durga is one of the most powerful and beloved deities in Hinduism and she is the Goddess of strength, protection, motherhood and destruction. She is a form of the Great Goddess: Mahadevi, and sometimes Maa Parvati.

The most famous story of Maa Durga is her battle with Mahishasura, a powerful demon. He was born from both a demon and buffalo, meaning that he could change form between the two.

In pictures, she is often depicted riding a tiger or lion, symbolising courage and strength. She has eight or ten arms, each holding a different weapon such as a trident and sword. She has a calm face and often wears bright red or gold garments. There is also normally a halo around her head.

After years of penance, he received a boon from Lord Brahma that no man or God could kill him. With so much power and a sinful ego, he decided to throw a war against the Gods. One by one, each of the devas (Gods) fell at his strength. He even defeated Lord Indra, the King of Swarga (Heaven), and declared himself the ruler of the world.

Each God gave her weapons: Shiva gave her a trishul (trident) and snake, Vishnu gave his chakra (discus), Indra gave his vajra (thunderbolt), Yama gave his staff, Varuna gave his shankh (conch), Agni gave his bharji (spear), Vayu gave his bow and arrow, Ganesha gave his sword, Brahma gave his lotus, Vishwakarma gave his khitaka (parashu). Each of the 10 weapons was held in each of her 10 hands.

All the Gods went to the Trimurti – Brahma, Vishnu and Shiva – for help and realised that since the boon stated that Mahishasura cannot be killed by man nor God, they needed a woman to defeat the demon. So, they put all their power together and created one radiant form: Durga was born.

Maa Durga declared war on Mahishasura and she fought against him for 9 nights (10 days). Mahishasura

kept changing his form between a human and buffalo to avoid defeat but finally, on the tenth day, as Mahishasura changed into the form of a massive buffalo, Durga jumped onto him, pinned him under her lion and slashed the trident into his neck, killing him.

We celebrate Maa Durga for her victory over Mahishasura, which symbolises the triumph of good over evil.

During Durga Puja, people visit temples, sing devotional songs (bhajans) and perform aarti with lamps and flowers. People also offer prasadam including flowers, fruits and mishti like laddus and barfi to Maa Durga. Bright colours like red, yellow and gold are worn and we sing, dance and chant Maa Durga's name.





The Meaning of the Days of Durga Puja

Day 1 Maha Shashti

Significance - On this day, the idol of Goddess Durga is traditionally unveiled and placed in the pandal (a temporary structure or decorated altar).

Rituals - The rituals include "Bodhan," the awakening of Goddess Durga, and inviting her to bless the devotees. A "Kalparambha" ritual may be performed, which involves the symbolic planting of a banana tree and offering prayers.

Day 2 Maha Saptami

Significance - On this day, the main rituals and prayers dedicated to Goddess Durga commence.

Rituals - Devotees offer anjali (ritualistic offerings) to the goddess and seek her blessings. Many rituals are performed, including "Kola Bou Snan" (bathing a banana tree symbolizing Goddess Durga), "Saptami Puja" (ritual worship of the goddess), and "Navapatrika Puja" (worship of nine different plants representing the nine forms of the goddess).

Day 3 Maha Ashtami

Significance - This day is considered one of the most significant days of Durga Puja, signifying the battle between Goddess Durga and the demon Mahishasura.

Rituals - The day begins with "Sandhi Puja," which is performed during the transition from Ashtami to Navami.

Devotees offer 108 lotus flowers to the goddess. Kumari Puja, where a young girl is worshipped as a representation of the goddess, is also a significant part of Maha Ashtami.

Day 4 Maha Nabami

Significance - On this day, the worship of Goddess Durga intensifies, and special offerings are made.

Rituals - Devotees perform the "Nabami Puja" with great devotion and offer bhog (food offerings) to the goddess. In some traditions, a "Siddha Kubera Puja" is conducted to seek prosperity.

Day 5 Maha Dashami

Significance – This day marks the farewell to Goddess Durga, as she departs for her heavenly abode.

Rituals - Devotees perform "Dashami Puja" to bid farewell to the goddess. The idol of Goddess Durga is taken in grand processions for immersion (Visarjan) in rivers or water bodies, symbolizing her return to Mount Kailash.
